

CAMP CALE CHECK-IN PROCESS

Check-in is outside and done in a “drive-through” manner. Parents/guardians will be asked to remain in their vehicles until it’s time to drop off their camper’s luggage. The route for check-in will be marked with cones. Volunteers or Cale staff will greet you at the checkpoints. Please make sure to follow directions so check-in is quick and simple for everyone who is arriving on Sunday. Please call the Cale office at (252) 264-2513 with any questions.

- The Camp Cale gate will open at 4:00pm on Sunday when check-in begins. Please do not arrive too early or Camp Cale Road will become congested. Remain behind the orange cone until directed to proceed. Please do not block driveways or the entry to Grassy Point.
- You will be greeted at the gate and told when to proceed to the first checkpoint.
- We do not accept payments and cannot help complete online forms at check-in. Online forms and final payment must be completed/received by May 31st. If you wish to leave mail for your camper, it will be collected at the registration checkpoint.
- You will be required to stop at the medical checkpoint if you have medication to check in or if your camper has allergies/medical conditions that need to be discussed with a staff member. Please have all medications in their original bottles/containers labeled with your camper's full name. Place all bottles/containers in a clear plastic bag labeled with your camper’s full name. A Cale staff member will review each medication and complete a Medication Form with you at this checkpoint. If your camper does not have medication to turn in or allergies/medical conditions to discuss with a staff member, you may pass the checkpoint and proceed to the next.
- There will be a boy camper drop off spot and a girl camper drop off spot. Once you reach this checkpoint, parents/guardians may exit their vehicle and unload their camper’s luggage. We ask that only adults assist their camper and all other children/siblings remain in the vehicle. This is where parents/guardians will say their goodbyes. A staff member will help the camper with their belongings and escort them to their bunkhouse. Parents/guardians are not allowed in the lodging facilities. Camp staff will be available to help campers make their beds and get settled in.
- After the final checkpoint, please follow the marked route toward the gate where you will be directed off campus.
